

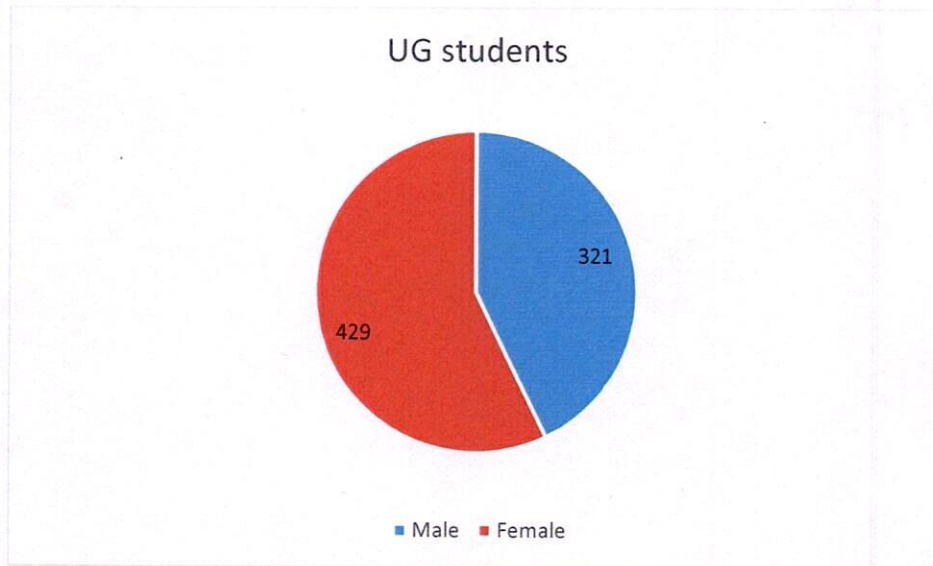
GENDER DISTRIBUTION AT VARIOUS STATUTORY AND NON STATUTORY LEVELS IN THE INSTITUTION

- Gender equity is also reflected at various statutory and non-statutory levels in the institution.
- The college admission process is NOT gender biased. Female students are admitted on the same basis as male students. There is always an equal ease of access to resources and opportunities, regardless of gender including economic participation and decision making. The total strength of the college is 2471 constituting 1538 females and 933 males in number.
- The total strength of the Permanent teaching staff is 152 in number, out of which 56 are female and 96 are male.
- The total strength of the students at SMVMCH are 821 in number, out of which 493 are females and 328 are males.
- Female participation in sports is highly encouraged in the college. The total strength of student's participation in sports is 170, out of which 50 are females and 120 are male.
- The student council (UG) is a proficient body constituting both female and male students, directed by a president and a Secretary.
- The total strength of the Non-teaching staff is 1498 in number, out of which 989 are female and 509 are male.
- The committee formed in the staff during any event in the college also maintains gender equity.
- The general group discussion in the class also justifies gender equity.
- Allocation of classroom duties equally reflects gender neutrality. A male and a female Class representative are nominated.
- Allocation of responsibility of organizing technical events is shared equally by both boys and girls.

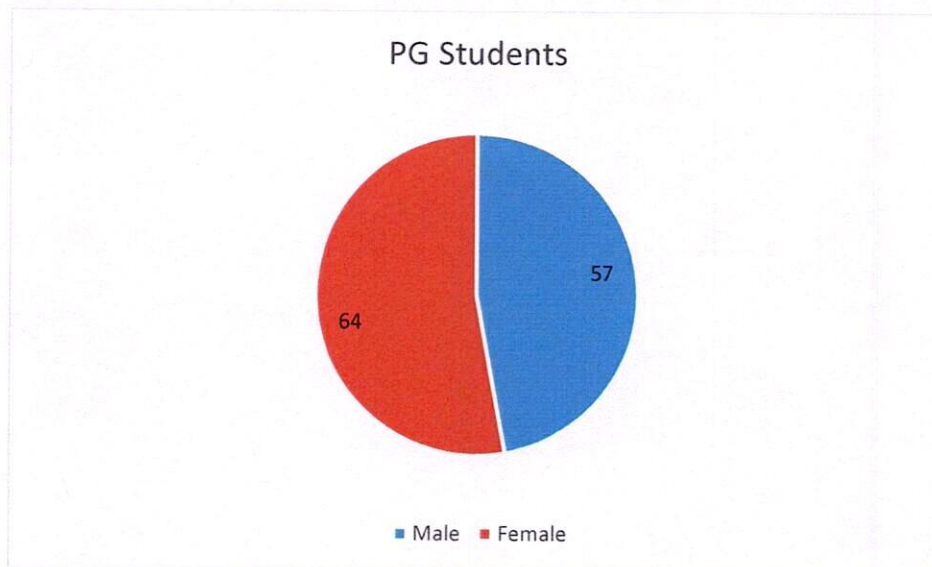
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Gender distribution among Undergraduate students

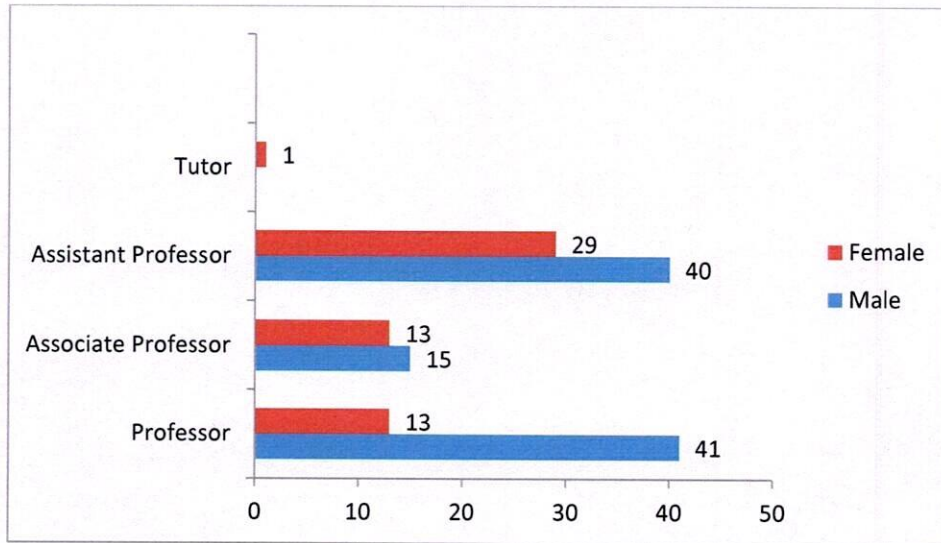


Gender distribution among Postgraduate students

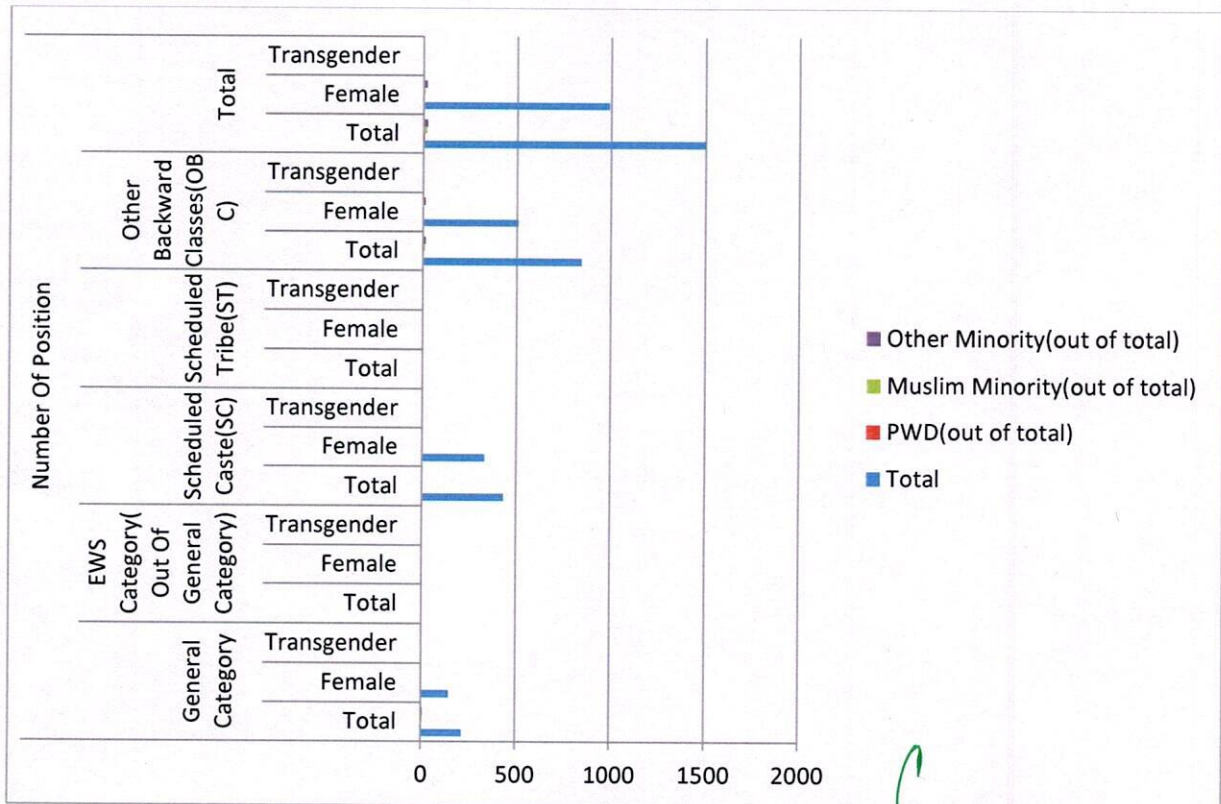


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Gender distribution among teaching staffs



Gender distribution among Non-Teaching staffs

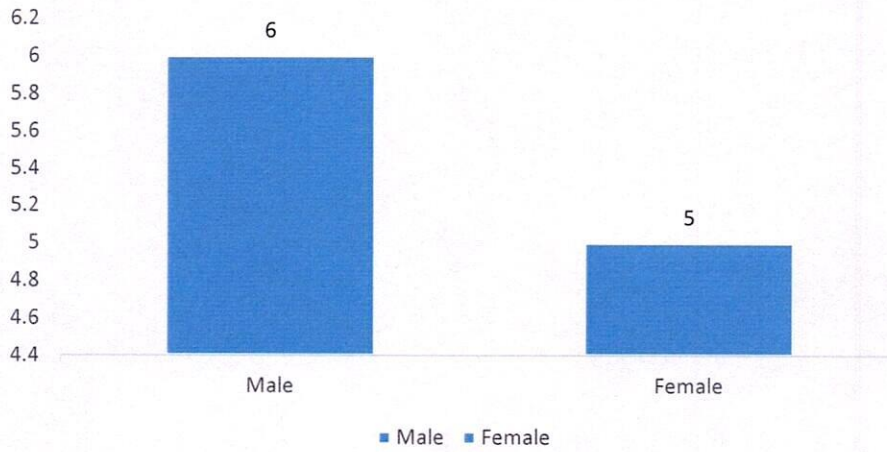


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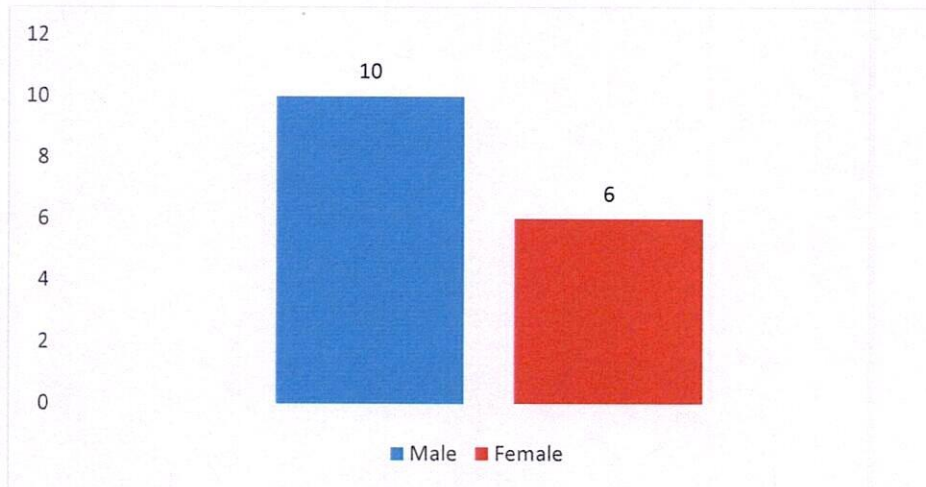


Women representation in various college committee

Grievances Redressal Committee-Student

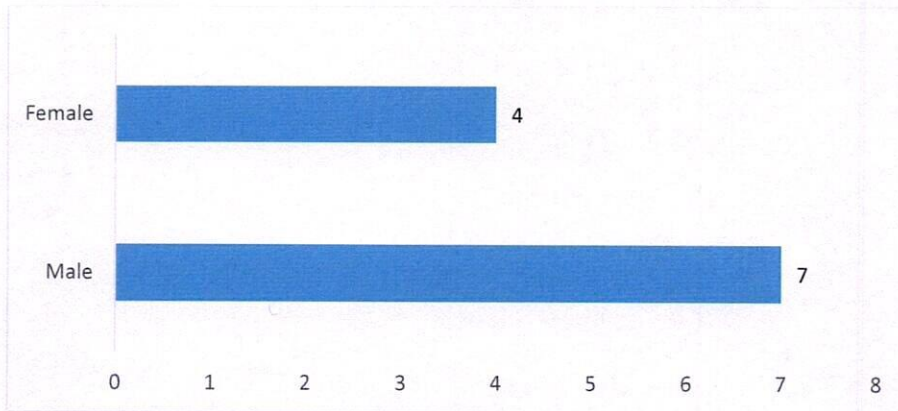


Hostel Committee

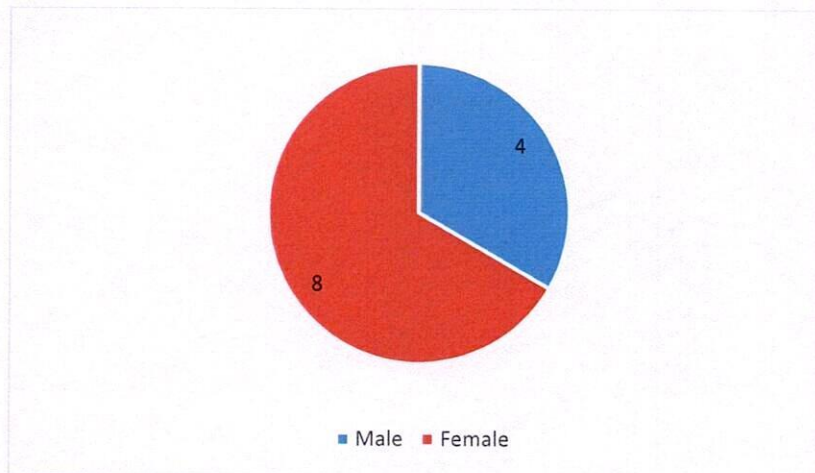


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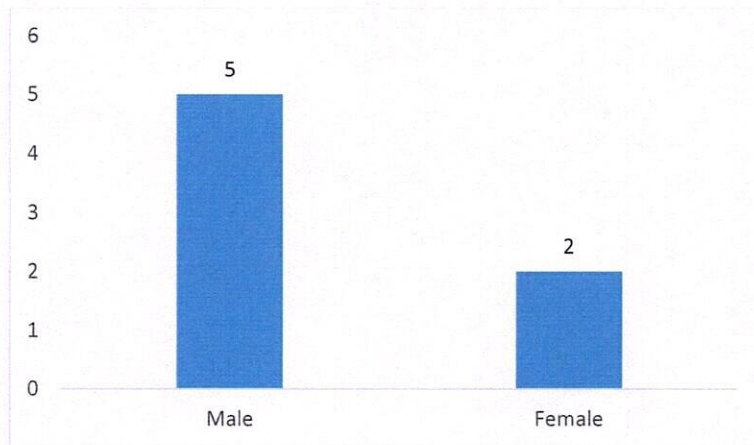

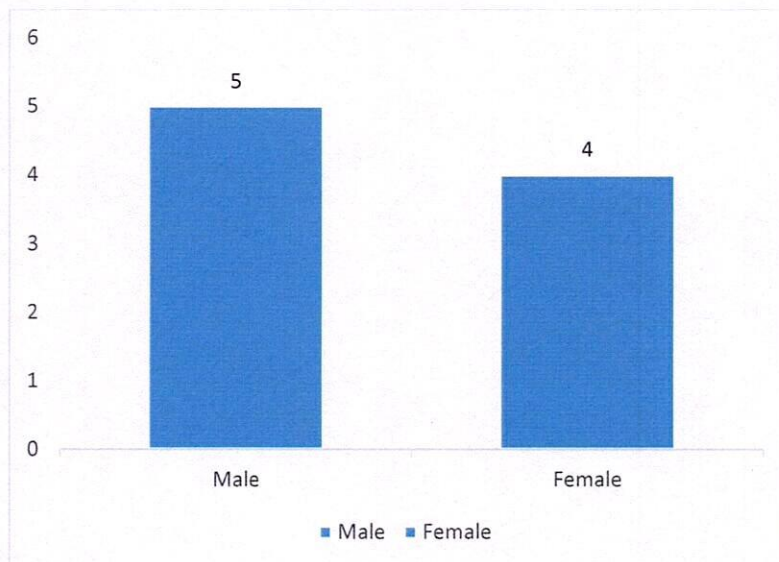
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Medical College and Hospital
Grievances Redressal Committee-Staff

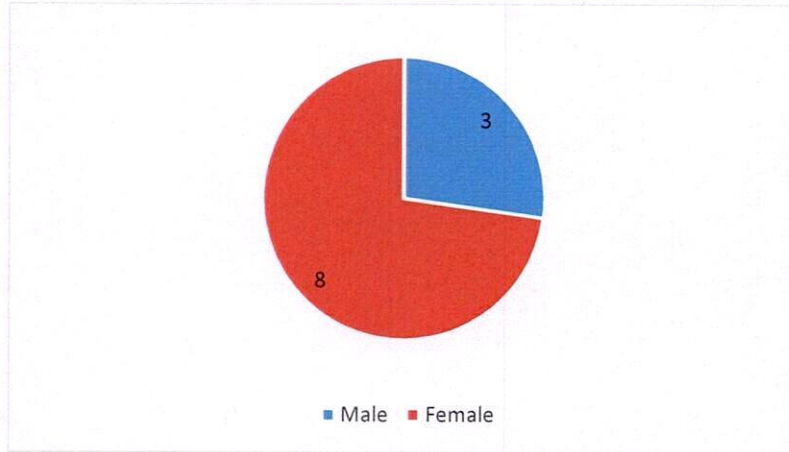


Cultural Committee
