Feedback from Parents

The feedback from parents was obtained with the help of feedback forms mailed to their individual mail id s and sent through students for those who could not access mail. The form consisted of 15items and was created in consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion from consultants. The items covered different areas including the admission procedure, infrastructure, assessment and feedback system for students, learning environment, support system and extracurricular activities. The parents were requested to rate their satisfaction on a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average, Poor and Not Applicable. We received feedback from 230parents. Forty nine percentage of the parents rated the CENTAC admission procedure as "Good", followed by 28% as "Very good". Around 49% of the parents were satisfied with the infrastructure including lab facilities, canteen, ICT facilities and transport facilities. Another 36% of parents felt that the college had "good" counselling and guidance for students, good assessment and feedback system. Academic discipline was rated as "Excellent" by 28% of the parents. The facilities which needed improvement were hostel and canteen facilities.

Feedback about Employee

As a part of the feedback system existing in our institution, we routinely collect feedback of students(undergraduatesandpostgraduates)fromtheemployers(preferablytheheadoftheinstitution/ head of the department) across various institutions in India (private/government) where the student is placed after passing out. The feedback are collected through online feedback forms on 13 items using a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average and Poor. Wecollectedfeedbackforaboutsixtythreestudentswhoareemployedorstudyingindifferentinstitutions in India and confidentiality of the data are maintained. Some of the key findings of the analysis are presented below in frequencies and percentages. The ability to contribute to the goal oftheorganizationwasratedas "Verygood" for 42% followed by "Excellent" for 9% of the employees and "Good" for 44%. Majority of students were rated to have "Good" planning and organization skills. Forty six percentage of students had "Good" communication skills. The ability to solve workplace problems was rated as "Good" for 58% of the students. Innovativeness and creativity was rated "Good" for 56% students. Involvement in social activities was rated as "Good" for 47% of the students. Forty five percentage of the students were rated to have "Very good" respect for values in life.

Feedback from Teachers

The process of receiving feedback from faculty at SMVMCH began with developing online google forms for easy administration and anonymous feedback collection. The form consisted of 15 items including satisfaction regarding course syllabus, teaching—learning methods, freedom to make innovations in teaching, infrastructure available and assessment methods. The items were generated based on consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion. Each item was rated on a five point Likert scale from "Strongly Agree" through "Neither Agree nor Disagree" to "StronglyDisagree". The link for the google form so created was mailed to the personal email id s of individual faculty.

The results were summarized based on the responses provided and presented in frequencies and percentages. More than 40% of the faculty were very satisfied with three items namely: "the course/syllabi of the subjects taught by me increased my interest, knowledge and perspective in the subject area, tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus and the college has given me full freedom to adopt new techniques / strategies of teaching such as group discussions, seminar presentations and learners' participation".

Around 75% of the faculty rated as "Agree" for the courses / syllabi taught to have a good balance between theory and application, 67% for well-defined objectives of the syllabi and 62% of the faculty felt that the books/journals etc. prescribed / listed as reference materials were relevant, updated and covered the entiresyllabi. Around half of them reported that they had a dequate freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of testing and assessment of students, teacher friendly administration, a dequate opportunities and support being provided to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications and good ICT facilities in the college. A few percentage of the faculty expressed dissatisfaction about the canteen and washroom facilities.

Feedback from parents

The feedback from parents was obtained with the help of feedback forms mailed to their individual mail id s and sent through students for those who could not access mail. The form consisted of 15items and was created in consensus with administrators, college council and expert opinion from consultants. The items covered different areas including the admission procedure, infrastructure, assessment and feedback system for students, learning environment, support system and extra-curricular activities. The parents were requested to rate their satisfaction on a five point Likert scale, excellent, very good, and good, average, poor and not applicable. We received feedback from 240parents. Forty nine percentage of the parents rated the centac admission procedure as "good", followed by 28% as "very good". Around 49% of the parents were satisfied with the infrastructure including lab facilities, canteen, ict facilities and transport facilities. Another 36% of parents felt that the college had "good" counselling and guidance for students, good assessment and feedback system. Academic discipline was rated as "excellent" by 28% of the parents. The facilities which needed improvement were hostel and canteen facilities.

Feedback from employers

As a part of the feedback system existing in our institution, we routinely collect feedback of students (undergraduates and postgraduates) from the employers (preferably the head of the institution/ head of the department) across various institutions in India (private/government) where the student is placed after passing out, the feedback are collected through online feedback forms on 13 items using a five point Likert scale, excellent, very good, good, average and poor. We collected feedback for about sixty three students who are employed or studying in different institutions in India and confidentiality of the data are maintained. Some of the key findings of the analysis are presented below in frequencies and percentages. The ability to contribute to the goal oftheorganizationwasratedas "verygood" for 42% followed by "excellent" for 9% of the employees and "good" for 44%. Majority of students were rated to have "good" planning and organization skills. Forty six percentage of students had "good" communication skills. The ability to solve workplace problems was rated as "good" for 58% of the students. Innovativeness and creativity was rated "good" for 56% students. Involvement in social activities was rated as "good" for 47% of the students. Forty five percentage of the students were rated to have "very good" respect for values in life.

Feedback from teachers

The process of receiving feedback from faculty at smvmch began with developing online google forms for easy administration and anonymous feedback collection. The form consisted of 15 items including satisfaction regarding course syllabus, teaching—learning methods, freedom to make innovations in teaching, infrastructure available and assessment methods. The items were generated based on consensus with administrators, college council and expert opinion. Each item was rated on a five point Likert scale from "strongly agree" through "neither agree nor disagree" to "strongly disagree". The link for the google form so created was mailed to the personal email id s of individual faculty.

The results were summarized based on the responses provided and presented in frequencies and Percentage. more than 40% of the faculty were very satisfied with three items namely: "the course/syllabi of the subjects taught by me increased my interest, knowledge and perspective in the subject area, tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus and the college has given me full freedom to adopt new techniques / strategies of teaching such as group discussions, seminar presentations and learners' participation".

Feedback from Parents

The feedback from parents was obtained with the help of feedback forms mailed to their individual mail id s and sent through students for those who could not access mail. The form consisted of 15 items and was created in consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion from consultants. The items covered different areas including the admission procedure, infrastructure, assessment and feedback system for students, learning environment, support system and extracurricular activities. The parents were requested to rate their satisfaction on a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average, Poor and Not Applicable. We received feedback from 235 parents. Fifty one percentage of the parents rated the CENTAC admission procedure as "Good", followed by 29% as "Very good". Around 48% of the parents were satisfied with the infrastructure including lab facilities, canteen, ICT facilities and transport facilities. Another 40% of parents felt that the college had "good" counselling and guidance for students, good assessment and feedback system. Academic discipline was rated as "Excellent" by 29% of the parents. The facilities which needed improvement were hostel and canteen facilities.

Feedback from employers

As a part of the feedback system existing in our institution, we routinely collect feedback of students (undergraduates and postgraduates) from the employers (preferably the head of the institution/ head of the department) across various institutions in India (private/government) where the student is placed after passing out. The feedback are collected through online feedback forms on 13 items using a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average and Poor. We collected feedback for about seventy students who are employed or studying in different institutions in India and confidentiality of the data are maintained. Some of the key findings of the analysis are presented below in frequencies and percentages. The ability to contribute to the goal of the organization was rated as "Very good" for 44% followed by "Excellent" for 9% of the employees and "Good" for 43%. Majority of students were rated to have "Good" planning and organization skills. Forty six percentage of students had "Good" communication skills. The ability to solve workplace problems was rated as "Good" for 57% of the students. Innovativeness and creativity was rated "Good" for 55% students. Involvement in social activities was rated as "Good" for 46% of the students. Forty five percentage of the students were rated to have "Very good" respect for values in life.

Feedback from Teachers

The process of receiving feedback from faculty at SMVMCH began with developing online google forms for easy administration and anonymous feedback collection. The form consisted of 15 items including satisfaction regarding course syllabus, teaching -learning methods, freedom to make innovations in teaching, infrastructure available and assessment methods. The items were generated based on consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion. Each item was rated on a five point Likert scale from "Strongly Agree"through "Neither Agree nor Disagree" to "Strongly Disagree". The link for the google form so created was mailed to the personal email id s of individual faculty.

The results were summarised based on the responses provided and presented in frequencies and percentages. More than 40% of the faculty were very satisfied with three items namely: "the course/syllabi of the subjects taught by me increased my interest, knowledge and perspective in the subject area, tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus and the college has given me full freedom to adopt new techniques / strategies of teaching such as group discussions, seminar presentations and learners' participation".

Around 73% of the faculty rated as "Agree" for the courses / syllabi taught to have a good balance between theory and application, 68% for well defined objectives of the syllabi and 64% of the faculty felt that the books/journals etc. prescribed / listed as reference materials were relevant, updated and covered the entire syllabi. Around half of them reported that they had adequatefreedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of testing and assessment of students, teacher friendly administration, adequate Sportunities and support being provided to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications and good ICT facilities in the college. A few percentage of the faculty expressed dissatisfaction about the canteen and washroom facilities. Professional Feedback Report: 2019-2020

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the Sri Manakula Vinayagar medical college and Hospital, in association with the every department of the college collects professional feedback on curriculum and the method of conduct of exams in our college. A specified sample is taken for the analysis. A well designed and structured questionnaire has been used to collect the responses. All the examiners were given an opportunity to rate the curriculum and the facilities provided by the college.

The objective of the feedback is to analyze the importance and relevance of the course and curriculum, the mode of conduct of exam, recent updates in the curriculum and the infrastructure of the college

The professional feedback of the academic year 2021-22 was analyzed and it is given below. The views and opinions of the professionals about the curriculum in detail and the various facilities provided by the college are measured in a descriptive manner. The questionnaire contains 4 questions and each question is analyzed. 1) Relevance of the course and curriculum. Both the undergraduate and post graduate examiners were appreciating the adherence of our curriculum to both national and international standards. The relevance of the course and curriculum is rated highly by all the respondents. About 97% of the respondents (excellent- 65%, very good-15% and good 15% respectively) have rated the course and curriculum as relevant and extremely recommendable. Only 3% of the respondents rated it as average and none as poor. 2) Recent advancements added in the curriculum. This question was given with a descriptive option. 98% of the responders were positive with all the examiners agreeing to the fact. The availability of all the recent techniques for diagnostic and treatment purpose was highly satisfactory. 3) Cocurricular activities in the college. The co-curricular activities in the college are analyzed and all the respondents (excellent 85%, very good 10% and good 5% respectively) have opined that the TRUE costivities of the college are extremely good. None of the respondents rated it as average and poor. 4) The mode of conduct of exam All the respondents (excellent 72%, very good 8% and good 20% respectively) have opined about the question on mode of conduct of exam as

ALITHEMESE PHOSENUTION of the respondents rated it as average and poor.

knowledge of experience and clinical exposure was appreciated by 96% of the responders. Friendly environment and effective support system was also brought into notice by 85% of the responders. 3) Co-curricular activities in the college. The co-curricular activities in the college are analyzed and all the respondents (excellent 85%, very good 10% and good 5% respectively) have opined that the activities of the college are extremely good. Especially the cultural and Simcon which is an educative conference which happens every year has kindled more innovative ideas in the wards at a very early stage. None of the respondents rated it as average and poor. 4) Influence of campus environment of the college in your life. All the respondents (excellent 72%, very good 8% and good 20% respectively) have opined about the question on influence of campus environment of the college in your life that the campus environment of the college has got tremendous influence on their life. None of the respondents rated it as average and poor. 5) Contribution of the college in the overall personality development. All the respondents' opinion about the question on the contribution of the college in the overall personality development (excellent 58%, very good 21% and good 21 %) is that the college has contributed well in to the overall personality development. None of the respondents rated it as average and poor. 6) Syllabus was job oriented. About 75% of the respondents (excellent 40%, very good 25%, and good 10%) responded positively to this question and opined that the syllabus was extremely job oriented. Only 15% rated it as average, and another 10% as poor. 7) Infrastructure and facilities provided by the college. Various suggestions to improve the hostel facilities with latest technology were also welcomed whole heartedly. All the respondents (excellent 85%, very good 10% and good 5%) responded positively to the question about infrastructure and facilities provided by the college and opined that the infrastructure and facilities provided by the college is extremely good. None of the respondents rated it as average and poor. 8) Mentorship programme was highly rated by all the responders with a maximum of 95% expressing their agreement towards it.

Alumni Feedback Report: 2019-2020

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the Sri Manakula Vinayagar medical college and Hospital, in association with the alumni associations of the college collects alumni feedback on syllabus and the facilities provided by the college annually. A specified sample is taken for the analysis. A well designed and structured questionnaire has been used to collect the responses. The members of the alumni associations were given an opportunity to rate the syllabus and the facilities provided by the college on a five scale measurement.

The objective of the feedback is to analyze the importance and relevance of the course and curriculum, the functional nature of the course, the co-curricular activities in the college, effectiveness of the mentorship program, opportunities of improvement, possibility of skill development program and the influence of campus environment of the college in their life. It also tries to evaluate the contribution of the college in their overall personality development, the career orientation of the syllabus, and also the infrastructure and facilities provided by the college.

The alumni feedback of the academic year 2021-22 was analyzed and it is given below. Efficiency of the syllabus, influence of the college on the development and availability of the facilities were the most pressing issues which was discussed in the feedback. The views and opinions of the alumni about the syllabus in detail and the various facilities provided by the college are measured in the five point scale (1-excellent, 2-very good, 3- good, 4-average, 5-poor). The questionnaire contains 9 questions and each question is analyzed. 1) Relevance of the course and curriculum. The relevance of the course and curriculumis rated highly by all the respondents. Feedback from Parents

The feedback from parents was obtained with the help of feedback forms mailed to their individual mail id s and sent through students for those who could not access mail. The form consisted of 15 items and was created in consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion from consultants. The items covered different areas including the admission procedure, infrastructure, assessment and feedback system for students, learning environment, support system and extracurricular activities. The parents were requested to rate their satisfaction on a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average, Poor and Not Applicable. We received feedback from 230 parents. Forty nine percentage of the parents rated the CENTAC admission procedure as "Good", followed by 28% as "Very good". Around 40% of the parents were satisfied with the infrastructure including lab facilities, canteen, ICT facilities and transport facilities. Another 40% of parents felt that the college had "good" counselling and guidance for students, good assessment and feedback system. Academic discipline was rated as "Excellent" by 27% of the parents. The facilities which needed improvement were hostel and canteen facilities.



As a part of the feedback system existing in our institution, we routinely collect feedback of students (undergraduates and postgraduates) from the employers (preferably the head of the institution/ head of the department) across various institutions in India (private/government) where the student is placed after passing out. The feedback are collected through online feedback forms on 13 items using a five point Likert scale, Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average and Poor. We collected feedback for about sixty three students who are employed or studying in different institutions in India and confidentiality of the data are maintained. Some of the key findings of the analysis are presented below in frequencies and percentages. The ability to contribute to the goal of the organization was rated as "Very good" for 42% followed by "Excellent" for 8% of the employees and "Good" for 42%. Majority of students were rated to have "Good" planning and organization skills. Forty five percentage of students had "Good" communication skills. The ability to solve workplace problems was rated as "Good" for 56% of the students. Innovativeness and creativity was rated "Good" for 53% students. Involvement in social activities was rated as "Good" for 45% of the students. Forty five percentage of the students were rated to have "Very good" respect for values in life.

Feedback from Teachers

The process of receiving feedback from faculty at SMVMCH began with developing online google forms for easy administration and anonymous feedback collection. The form consisted of 15 items including satisfaction regarding course syllabus, teaching -learning methods, freedom to make innovations in teaching, infrastructure available and assessment methods. The items were generated based on consensus with administrators, College council and expert opinion. Each item was rated on a five point Likert scale from "Strongly Agree" through "Neither Agree nor Disagree" to "Strongly Disagree". The link for the google form so created was mailed to the personal email id s of individual faculty.

The results were summarised based on the responses provided and presented in frequencies and percentages.
