## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of understanding is executed on this 24th day of October, 2018 between the President of India through the DIRECTOR, DIRECTORATE OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE SERVICES, PUDUCHERRY with the SRI MANAKULA VINAYAGAR MEDICAL COLLEGE AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE, PUDUCHERRY.

#### Preamble

The Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Services, Puducherry and the Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Research Institute, Puducherry hereinafter called the "parties" found it to be mutually beneficial to have a formal understanding between the two partners in adopting Primary Health Centre(s) for running first/second shifts to provide round the clock health care to the residents of Union Territory of Puducherry.

Both the partners have arrived at an understanding as indicated below:

#### 1. The Parties

The parties of this Memorandum of Understanding are the Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Services, Puducherry represented by the Director, Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Services, Puducherry on one side and the Dean, Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Research Institute, Puducherry on the other side.

## 2. Objective

To adopt Primary Health Centres as mentioned below by the private medical colleges to run two shifts (8AM to 2PM and 2PM to 8 PM) or evening shift (2PM to 8 PM) as the case may be for providing round the clock health care to the residents of Union Territory of Puducherry

#### 3. Details of Understanding

The parties, after due consideration and consultation of various aspects have arrived at the following understandings on the roles and responsibilities to be fulfilled by them in executing and implementing the Memorandum of Understanding

#### Role and Responsibilities of Medical College

- (i). The medical college will run two shifts (2PM to 8 PM) and night shift (8PM to 8AM) or evening shift (2PM to 8 PM) as the case may be in the adopted Primary Health Centres.
- (ii). The Medical College will post Medical Officers, Nursing Personnels and para-medical staffs as the case may be.

# OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Sub: Health - Adoption / Utilization of Govt. Hospitals / CHCs / PHCs by Private Medical /Nursing / Paramedical Institutions - Reg.

Ref: 1. This Secretariat Office Memorandum No.204-98/Health/H4 dated:30-06-2003. 2. This Secretariat Office Memorandum No. 204-98/Health/H5 dated: 30-10-2013. &&&&&&

As per the Office Memorandas cited under references, permission is being granted to any Medical Institution for utilizing the Government Health Institutions viz. Hospitals/CHCs/PHCs by Private Medical/Nursing/Paramedical Institutions for a maximum period of 3 years with the condition that the college should construct/establish their own PHC within the period. However, some of the private Medical/Nursing/Paramedical Institutions are still approaching for the utilization of Government Health Institutions beyond 3 years.

According, to the Office Memorandum cited under reference (2) the private nursing/paramedical colleges has to remit an amount of Rs.2,000/- per student per annum for utilizing the Government Health Institutions to impart training to their students. As the number of students utilizing Government Health Institutions have increased manifold, there is no sufficient room/space in the Govt. Hospitals/PHCs/CHCs, in order to curtail/restrict the increase inflow of students from private institutions, it is decided to enhance the annual fee paid by the Private Medical Colleges/Nursing/Para-Medical institutions for utilizing the Government Health Institution.

- 3. In this regard, a committee has been constituted under the Chairmanship of Director (Health), with other officials from the Health Department to revise the fees and the Committee has submitted its recommendation to enhance the existing fee structure as follows:
- A fee of Rs.4,000/- per student / per annum instead of Rs.2,000/- per student/ per annum has to be remitted for Nursing Students.
- A fee of Rs.5,000/- per student / per annum instead of Rs.2,000/- per student/ per annum has to be remitted for Medical Students.
- 4. Hence, in partial modification of the Office Memorandas cited under reference, the Government has decided to permit the Private Medical Colleges/Nursing/Para-Medical institutions to utilize the Government Health Institutions viz. Govt. Hospitals/PHCs/CHCs after remitting of the above mentioned enhanced fee as applicable, with effect from the academic year 2015-16.
- Apart from the above modification, all other conditions contained in the Office Memoranda cited under reference remains unaltered.
